134 Physicians Particiapting As the industry group swung nto action, Dr. Gerald M. Eastham, chairman of the doctors campaign committee, disclosed that 134 physicians in the area have agreed to participate financially in the campaign. The medical steering committee had set a goal of \$150,000 for the doctors, Dr. Eastham said, but with the unexpectedly large number of physicians who have agreed to take part, this total may be increased. The doctors will hold another meeting within the next two weeks to discuss the matter.

Meanwhile, the medical steering committee is proceeding with plans for formation of the medical staff so it will be a functioning unit when the hospital opens its doors early in 1958, and is conferring with the architect to assure that the most modern and effective type of medical facility will be built.

The new voluntary, nonprofit, tax-free institution will be located on 10 acres on Torrance Blvd. near the intersec tion of Hawthorne Blvd. and will serve Torrance, Playa del Rey, El Segundo, Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, El Nido, Walteria, Lomita, Palos Verdes, and Rolling Hills, It will be planned for 125-beds but will be expandable to 250 beds.
