Traffic accidents are always a problem. They have become an acute problem in Torrance in recent months. Traffic deaths have reached a record high of 13. Adolph De Ha of Palos Verdes, a Torrance Press subscriber, has been concerned enough to write several letters to the editor regarding this deplorable situation and also submitted the following suggestions in the form of a questionaire. How do you feel about this matter? Fill out the questionaire and return it to the Torrance Press. Or write us a letter. We'll publish the results. YES NO

1) Installing governors on all cars that are driven by persons that were convicted once for a crime or felony, or for drunken or reckless driving and also by paroled persons. These governors would be regulated only by the Police Dept.

2) Governors in other cars, too, so that even the safe driver could regulate his own speed in the different speed areas. '3) Instead of hand signals and the directional signals which are often invisible by day or unseen by the following car, installing red lighted indicators, right and left, about 12 inches long and the lamp about 4 inches in diameter. Rear

signals on the top insteadof the bottom. 4) Equipping all cars with lit speed indicators like those atop the taxis, to check the speeders and the license plate next to the speed indicator so that the speed and license number could be photographed by a police officer from the curb, instead having to give the violator a wild chase thus en-

dangering some other drivers. 5) Restrict as much as possible the movement of the dangerous police cars. Equip all traffic officers with cameras and flash bulbs. This would have the wanted effect and the traffic violators would be punished nevertheless.

6) Stiffer penalties for drunken and reckless driving.

7) Higher age limit for issuing new drivers licenses.

8) Certain restrictions for smokers. The National Automobile Club warns that lighting a cigaret with a match or cigaret lighter causes a momentary blinding.

9) Instead the often hidden stop signs, obligatory blinking overhead red lights would also reduce certain traffic

10) Uniform street markings should be adopted for the whole Country or at least for a whole State and not street markings atop a post, others on corner pillars, others again on the curb, etc. a 11) Stricter enforcement about stepping out of cars on the

curb side, not on the traffic side. 12) Would you rather have the wheel on the curb side?

13) A passenger sitting in the front row has to sit in the opposite) () corner.

14) When checking overparking, drivers leaving their keys in the car should be penalized, too.

15) Every driver should undergo a physical checkup every two years for the Department of Motor Vehicles. 16) Compulsory inspection of all cars, yearly, by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

17) Governors on the cars of a certain age group should be also regulated by the Police Department.

18) Would you be willing to participate on a "Citizens Committee for Traffic Improvement?"
