CHRISTMAS ORNAMENTS NOT TO BUY

Be careful when purchasing miniature animals or figures for holiday decorations or table center-pieces, warns fire Chief J. J. Benner. These miniatures may be purchased in two types of material—one of which will burn at a very slow rate, while the other is highly flammable. The items shown here are the highly flammable nitro-cellulose (celluloid) plastic material and may be readily identified, as the plastic material is paper-thin and easily indented by gentle pressure of the fingers being exerted on the sides of the items.
