

Superintendent Calls for Strong Anti-Red Approach in Schools

Communism came in for a blistering attack Monday when Dr. J. H. Hull, superintendent of schools, called for an outspoken anti-Communist approach in classrooms throughout the Torrance Unified School Dis-

Dr. Hull, speaking before members of the Torrance Educational Advisory Committee, announced that he will declare this a matter of policy throughout the district "unless instructed otherwise by the Board of Education."

Hull began his remarks by saying that he wished to "make suggestion and ask a question" which he put as follows: "Do we have a right to teach Americanism and Democracy passively? Dont we have a responsibility if we believe in this way of life to teach the values of it and to point out the

horrors of Communism?" Growing Scourge

Fifty years ago, Hull said, Communism was just a flicker in the wilderness. Today there are 900 million Communists.

The Communists have the conquest of the world spelled out in blueprints and documents, he went on to say. From Russia they have spread to Asia. From Asia they are going to India and then to Africa by way of the Middle East.

Eventually, the West, and finally America, will be isolated. The Communists use clever bait, the educator went on to say. They speak of peace, but what they mean to say is: let us run things, so there won't be any wars. They speak of co-existence, meaning, keep out of war so the Communists can

Communism, Hull continued, has no respect for human life. Incompatible Beliefs

Communists do not believe in the dignity of the individual. Their belief is the opposite of what we believe, Hull said. Worst of all, he pointed out, Communism is growing and

"I can't read this stuff from Hungary and the other countries without feeling that we must tell our children," he exclaimed. "We can't be mild. We must be positive in our To Run For approach . . . it's no longer enough just to present the facts to the kids. We must be strong in our anti-Communist

Hull said that five years ago the local school district had a Communist teacher who was subsequently expelled. Since then, every teacher teaching here is carefully screened through state investigating officials before being hired.

Group's Views

After presenting his views, Hull asked for a discussion by members of the TEAC group.

One individual stated that by obtaining the facts about Communism and seeking after Truth, Democracy will only be strengthened, and the decision will be made for Democracy.

When asked at what grade level Communism would be covered, Hull asked, "Is there any grade level at which it shouldn't be covered?"

Hull also said that he did not want to give the impression that the schools have not been stressing these hings. He said that he was just asking for a more intensified approach. A number of individuals expressed the view that it is a
