Reynolds Aluminum Plant Ready By Late Summer

Reynolds Metals co., an aluminum processing plant, should be in full operation here within six to nine months, according to R. S. Reynolds Jr., president of the firm.

The plant, now under construction on a 44-acre site formerly occupied by Pacific Electric shops near Crenshaw Blvd. and Dominguez st., will employ more than 1000 persons, Reynolds said.

Reynolds, who visited the area last week, said plant is being converted at a cost of more than \$1 million.

Its primary production will be aluminum packaging, such as the trays used in frozen dinners.

Inspection Tour
 Here from his headquarters in Richmond, Va., Reynolds made an inspection tour of the Torrance project and of the laboratories of Robertshaw Fulton co., of which he is board chairman.

At the same time, Reynolds predicted that production and consumption of aluminum should set new records in 1957. He declared that the expanding market was one reason that his firm was opening the

new plant. Reynolds Metals supplies about 30 percent of the aluminum tonnage, which this year should be about 2,550,000 tons, some 200,000 tons higher than last year's record-breaking production.

Demand Seen
 Reynolds pointed out that the demand for aluminum was growing. Autos now use four times as much aluminum as they did 10 years ago, he said, and will use even more, perhaps for engines. More aluminum also is being used in skyscrapers and the demand grows for more lightweight products which can be shipped by air.

Reynolds Metals also has other foil plants in Vernon, Calif.; St. Louis, Mo.; Richmond, Va.; Louisville, Ky.; Listerhill, Ala.; and Harrison N. J.
