Wilcox also stated that 2830 youngsters have enjoyed the Torrrance YMCA activities in 1956, and that he hopes to serve 4500 in 1957.

The main speaker of the evening was a young YMCA secretary, Arnold Leonard, who served as a symbol of the new staff member that the YMCA hopes to hire.

If the goal is reached, the Torrance YMCA will be able to increase to two full-time trained persons.

Leonard, as one of the aspirants for the post, spoke of his dreams of what he could do as a member of the Torrrance staff. Leonard felt that the local program could be doubled with two men, and that adequate supervision of leaders and high school programs would be possible with the enlarged staff. He challenged the group to support their "All America YMCA in their All America City."
