3. Maneuvering between six pairs of blocks, 6 inches between each pair on a 60-foot runway, without touching the blocks.

4. Drive around a circle 18feet in diameter remaining within a 2-foot confine. 5. Drive between 2 pairs of

upright posts or stanchions, 18inches apart and 30-feet from each other. 6. Make a U-turn within the

confines of a 9x30-foot area without the feet touching the ground at any time.

7. Stop the bicycle in a rec tangular area, 6x12-feet, with both feet remaining on the petals.
