

## SUPERIORITY OF WOMEN TOPIC AT EL CAMINO

Dr. Ashley Mantagu anthropologist, author, and lecturer will speak on the "Natural Superiority of Women" at El Camino Tuesday, 8:15 p.m., in the Campus Theatre.

Fresh from a \$32,000 triumph on a national television program, Dr. Mantagu has been professor of anatomy, first at New York University and later at the Hahneman Medical College and Hospital in Philadelphia.

The speaker whose book, "The Natural Superiority of Women," became a best seller in 1953, set off a chorus of rave reviews throughout the nation's press. His article on the same subject was published in the Saturday Review of Literature the year before.

In his lecture on this subject Dr. Mantagu cites evidence for his contention that from the biological and social standpoints, the female is the superior creature. He discusses the various myths that have been in circulation about the female's inferiority for millennia and demonstrates their fallaciousness. It is not Dr. Mantagu's avowed purpose to demote men by elevating women, but as a scientist, to state facts.
