### EDITORIAL

### Green Light -- Let's Go

Except for a slight delay caused by a ruling to recirculate petitions, downtown Torrance can now go ahead with its parking, traffic and shopping program.

Now that the Torrance City Council, after a lag of two years, has unanimously endorsed plans for the revised off-street parking district and other vital proposals for improved traffic conditions in downtown Torrance, it is up to City Manager George Stevens to go full speed ahead on the project.

According to Ralph Dorsey, the city's traffic expert, downtown Torrance can be put into good shape and the assessment district completed within

Major developments which will facilitate parking and shopping are the proposed off-street parking lots as seen in the above map; straightening of the Torrance blvd.-Border ave. intersection; diagonal parking and parking meters along Cabrillo (eliminating center-street parking); and strict parking enforcement by women Parking Meter Police (Meter Maids) to assure traffic turn-over.

While the final answer to Torrance's shopping needs is up to the merchants themselves, the city can go a long way in aiding the development of the downtown business district.

This help will be amply repaid by the additional revenues the city will receive.

Full responsibility for pushing this project to completion now rests with City Manager Stevens.

### **New Petitions Needed** For Parking District

Downtown Torrance suffered a new set-back this week when it was discovered that the old petitions are insufficient and new petitions must be circulated for the revised off-street parking district.

City Attorney Stanley Remelmeyer informed the City Council that this is necessary according to a letter from O'Melveny and Myers, bonding agents.

Mayor Albert Isen asked City Manager George Stevens to hurry things up by hiring an individual to concentrate on getting these signatures.

Isen believes that this work can be concluded in about a month and that the city will then be right up to date again.
