A total of 292 students from both high schools availed themselves of the employment program which permitted them to get out of school early.

Asked if the students were courteous, friendly, neat, honest, hard working, ambitious and alert, 94% of the employers answered ves. Employers indicated that 85% of the students had sufficient mastery of their particular skill.

Among exceptional qualities emphasized by employers were the following: ready at all times to assume responsibilities; catch on quickly; mechanically minded; have offered student steady work after graduation; good honest ability; good sales person, very courteous; very hard worker; used very good judgment and was very efficient and ambitious; as good as regular full-time employes.

Student comments included the following: I still like school better; I will work harder in school; it proved the necessity of good school training; I was anxious to get back to school; I now choose school over work; learning to take criticism was best for me; I learned how to talk to people;




