90-Acre Site

"Located on a 90-acre site secured without charge through the Los Angeles County Board pus saw its first construction start in 1948, when enrollment was scarcely over 1000 students. Building during the first fiveyear period was accomplished by means of a special tax of 25c per \$100 assessed evaluation," Carl G. Arfwedson, director of business, announced.

"During the second five-year period of expansion, the district voted to decrease the special tax to 20c. This provision expires this year. The May 17 ballot will ask the communities which the college serves to continue the same tax rate to permit build- 15,000 within the next five years ing to accommodate the anticipated enrollment," Arfwedson istration. reported

Cause Of Growth

"Growth," the administrator eited, "is largely due to the fact that eight new high schools have either been built or placed under construction since the establishment of the college." The college district now includes 13 public high schools. Other students in the district enter from several private high schools in the area

"Continuance of the tax will enable the college to procede with the construction of sorely needed buildings," the college administrator emphasized. Community demand for courses in the field of mathematics and engineering have placed buildng construction in this area high on the priority list.

Also needed are buildings for the natural sciences, language arts, men's shower and exercise rooms, shops, radio-electronics, applied arts, auditorium, student store, and audio-visual facilities. Additions are planned for the Phone FA. 8-0220 library, physics, and chemistry buildings, life science, art, cafeteria, men's gym, and ware-
