"Normally" he reported, "only 60 cents of each dollar would remain in the state, and 40 cents would be forwarded to the national office, but because so much important research is being done in California universities and hospitals, the increased amount is used here."

"About \$5,000,000 has been appropriated for cancer research in California alone since 1946," Vico added.

DISASTER CHAIRMAN REPORTS

Stan Remelmeyer, volunteer disaster chairman for the Torrance branch of the American Red Cross, has chosen this time during the annual Red Cross Fund Campaign, to make a committee report.

Dr. W. H. Lowe and John Kesson were assistant chairmen, with George H. Colburn specifically in charge of food, Walter L. Kroneberger Jr., handling shelter problems, and Mrs. Walter West, vice-chairman of the local Red Cross branch, in charge of a mobile group to prepare food. The problem of clothing will be handled by George Powell of the Civil Defense with whom the Torrance Red Cross works in close cooperation on all problems of transportation and communication.

Depending upon the size of the disaster and the number of persons involved, one shelter or a number of shelters will be opened. There are fourteen school and church buildings in key positions, which will afford shelter to as many as 4,000 persons, and provisions can be made to feed as many as 6,300.

Supervisors Adopt Policy On Fencing

On motion of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, the board of supervisors has adopted a new policy on the fencing of flood control channels, which will make possible the fencing of large reaches of Dominguez channel, it was announced this week.

"If adoption of this new policy and fencing of the channel prevents the death of one child, it will certainly be worthwhile," Supervisor Hahn declared in urging adoption of the new policy.

Five conditions must be met to permit the erection of protective fencing along channels.

1. Existing of an attractive nuisance which may present a hazard to life.

2. Flood control district has performed some channel work in the past which has changed former natural stream conditions.

3. Flood control district has the right of way.

4. Where flood control district would normally construct right of way fencing at some future date in connection with planned permanent channel improvements to prevent unauthorized encroachments upon the right of way, and there is also a need to prevent such encroachments at the present time.

5. Where subdivision development of adjacent land is not imminent.

Flood control engineers are now studying several portions of Dominguez channel, including the Torrance section, to determine whether fencing can now be erected in accordance with the new policy.

It is expected that definite recommendations of fencing of these portions will be made to the board of supervisors by April 9, Supervisor Hahn stated.
