\$50,000 Suit Filed In Redondo Pier 'Scandal'

Damages of more than \$50,000 were demanded in a taxpayer's suit calling for the eviction of the leaseholders of Monstad Pier, Redondo Beach's foremost tourist attraction

The suit, filed Friday in Los Angeles Superior Court, de-clares that the city is paid only \$2000 annually under an invalid master lease, while subsidiary leases and corporations receive an income of more than \$250,-000 a year from the recreational facility.

Named in the suit are Daisy H. Monstad and Attorney William MacFaden as known leaseholders of the sportsfishing, restaurant and amusement pier, and listed all five city councilmen, Mayor J. Russell Shea and City Attorney Frank L. Perry as co-defendants.

Virgil C. Kasian, 2301 Ralston Lane, complainant in the action, stipulated that city officials were being sued only in their official capacities. However, the suit names City


Attorney Perry and Councilman Chester Dailey as members of an alleged conspiracy to extend favorable terms of the lease, despite several better offers to the city.






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
