Torrance Ranchero Days To Be Celebrated Here

Plans for what promises to be the largest civic celebration in Torrance's history were announced today by Chamber of Commerce Manager Dick Fitzgerald who will coordinate the five-day event called "Torrance Ranchero Days."

Ranchero Days will start on Wednesday, July 24 and conclude on Sunday, July 28. Highlights will include a giant parade on Saturday, July 27, conducted by the Torrance Mounted Police under Lt. D. C. Cook and financed by the Chamber of Commerce; a wild west style rodeo on July 27 and 28 sponsored by the Lions Club in cooperation with the Mounted Police; a huge carnival and mid-way handled by the Junior Chamber of Commerce; the selection of "Miss Torrance" conducted by the Torrance Area Youth Band; an industrial display in a huge 400

foot tent sponsored by the Industrial Division of the Chamber of Commerce under Chairman Glen Koger of Rome Cable corporation, a gigantic bar-b-q by the Civitan Club; and all types of food booths and concessions sponsored by any Torrance group that wants to participate.

A meeting of all organizations, to formulate plans and policy for the celebration, has been scheduled for Monday, April 29 at 7:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. Fitzgerald stated, adding that all interested organizations are urged to send representatives.

On Wednesday night, April 24, at 7:30, commissioners and officials will meet at the Palms restaurant to find the answer to the problem of providing recreation for the citizens of a mushrooming area.

Commissioners on the panel, "The Commissioners Speak," will include Jack Kirkpatrick of Hawthorne, Mrs. W. F. MacQueen of El Segundo, Mrs. Malvina Gray of Gardena, G. Donovan of Redondo Beach, and Mrs. Herma Tillim of Torrance.

Also on the panel will be Mrs. Alys Drobnick, recently elected to the City Council in Santa Monica. Mrs. Drobnick has been very active in promoting recreation and is the first woman ever to be elected to the Santa Monica City Council.

At least 100 public recreation officials from various Los Angeles County communities plan to attend.

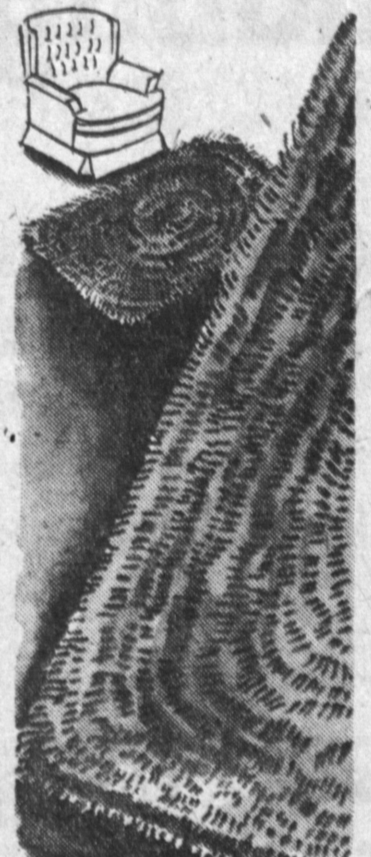
