Best orator was Ron Hargrove, and the best journalist

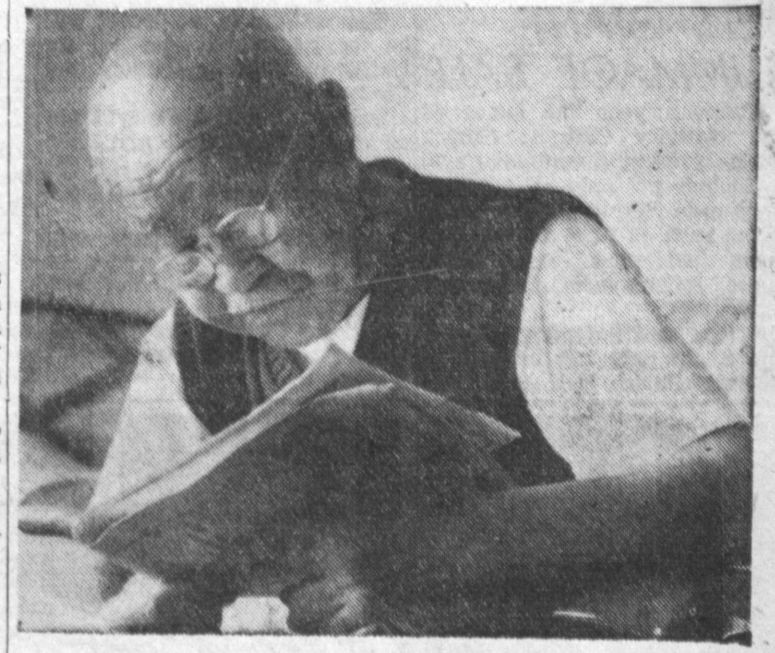
was Emma Mills.

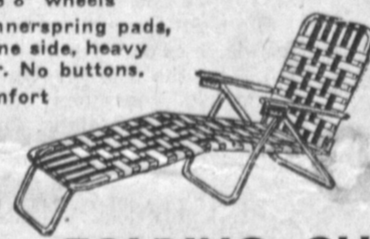

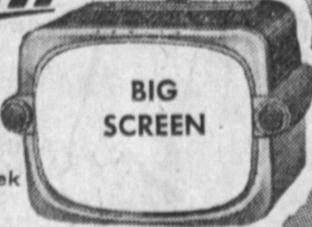

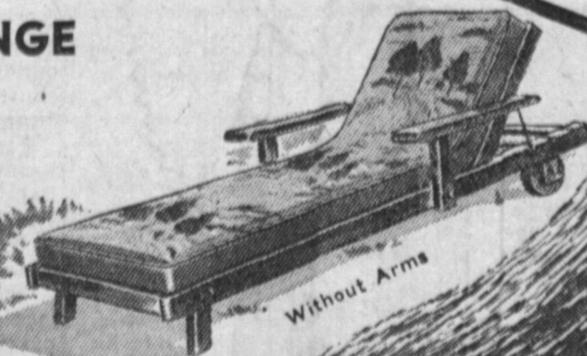
