One of her most exciting experiences since she learned of her selection, was visiting the Finnish Church in Los Angeles where she met a woman who knows the Tyrnis in Finland-just another indication of how "small the world is," she said. Getting shots, visa and a passport, have made the dream of going to Europe become a definite reality.

The summer climate in Finland is similar to ours which makes packing an easy chore. The only unusual feature of the climate is that during the summer months there are about 19 hours of daylight every day because it is so near the Arctic Circle. This means she will have just that much more daylight to see the country before returning in September.
