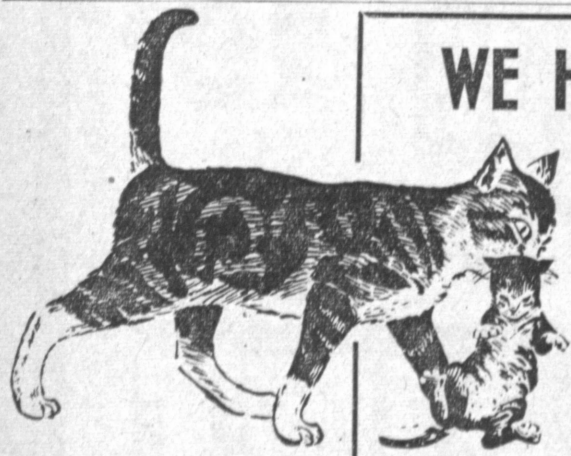

New Starlite Homes On Display This Week-End

Three completed models are now on display at the corner of 214th and Main. The firm is rushing construction of the additional 40 homes, all with three bedrooms and one and a half bath, to meet the demand, it was stated by Lucile Valek, sales agents.

Although the grand opening of the Starlite Homes has not been scheduled, several homes have been sold.

Expected to boost sales are the custom quality, construction found only in a Starlite Home. For Years Butcher has planned to give home owners in the Torrance area a home that they would be proud of, a home

that has perfect family planning. The daylight living area is separated for instance, from the sleeping area, which assures easier house keeping, a feature the Starlite Homes are noted for.

Homes are available in 12 different exteriors based on three basic floor plans, including such features as Western Holly built-in ranges and ovens, in color. Aluminum sliding glass doors, heavy shake roof, forced air heating, formica tops, twin sinks, slab doors, insulation and weather stripping, and radio intercom throughout the house.

Starlite Homes are priced at \$16,950 with 10 per cent down.
