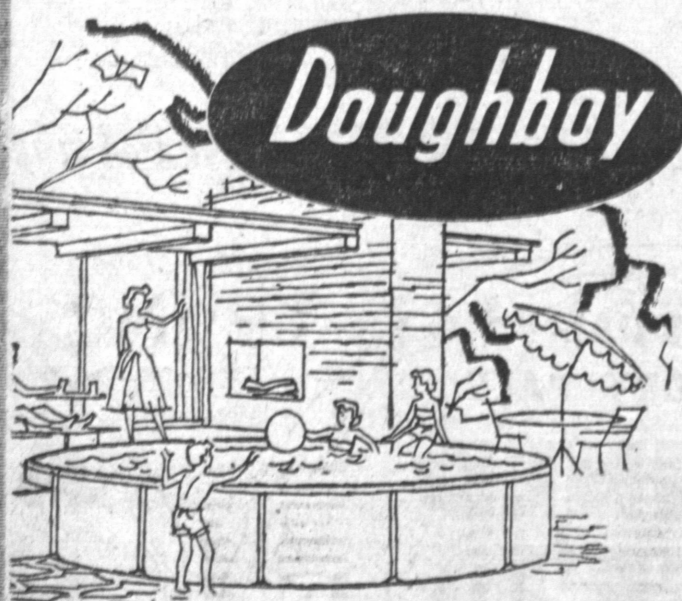

Parks Offer Special Programs for Summer

The parks of Torrance are in the midst of summer vacation activities for youngsters and adults. The parks now in operation include Torrance, El Retiro, Sea-Aire, Waleria, McMaster and El Nido. These areas are open from 9 a.m. until evening and the summer session will extend through August 30.

The playgrounds include Anza, Arlington, Carl Steele, Casimir, Carr, Crenshaw, Greenwood, Hillside, Howard Wood, Madrona, Meadow Park, Newton, Perry, Riviera, Seaside and Waleria schools.

Following is a list of those activities and special events that are planned for the week of July 8 through July 12. These are scheduled for the various Torrance parks:

The theme for this week is "let's pretend."

TORRANCE PARK

From 11-1 on July 8, the story hour will feature the "story lady"; at 2 there will be tournaments. On July 9 the crafts program will be in session at 10; a field trip is planned from 1-4 on July 10 there will be tournaments at 10 and from 1-4 the music program will be held with Jim Davidson in charge. A baseball game is planned at 10 on July 11 and at the same time circle games; crafts is scheduled for 2. On July 12 there will be free play from 9-12; a "backwards" party is planned for 3.

EL RETIRO:

On July 8 from 10-12 there will be a girls' softball practice; from 1-3, crafts and from 3-5, baseball practice and or-

ganized outdoor games. The program from 3-5 is planned for everyday. On July 9 from 10-12 there will be a "tiny tot" program where there will be special activities such as simple games, story time, dancing, and music. This program includes ages 4-9; from 1-3 there will be crafts. On July 10 from 9:30-11, girls' softball; a hamburger feed and punch is planned from 12-3.

The "tiny tot" program will be held at 10 on July 11; crafts from 1-3. On July 12 at 12:30 there will be a "Mother Goose" day dress parade. Children will come dressed as Mother Goose characters. Punch will be served.

SEA-AIRE:

On July 8 at 10:45 movies will be shown; at 1 the instrumental music program with Jim Davidson directing is planned. Tournaments are scheduled for 10 on July 9 and at 12 there will be a cook-out with hot dogs and punch on the menu. The cost

will be 15c a serving. Bicycle races will follow the cook-out. On July 10 at 11:30 the "story lady" will present her story hour; at 1 tournaments will be held.

A field trip is scheduled for July 11. On July 12, at 1:30, there will be a "let's pretend" party at which time the children will come dressed as the person they would most like to be. There will be a costume contest at this time.

WALERIA:

Tournaments are scheduled for every morning from 9:30-10:30. Crafts will be held on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 1-3. July 8 is a regular program day.

On July 9, at 10:45, a movie is planned. The story hour is scheduled for July 10 at 9:30; at 1:30 there will be a nature hunt.

On July 11, at 1:30, there will be a watermelon feed at 5c a serving. At 1 on July 12 there will be a pet parade and after the parade, everyone will participate in "charades."

McMASTER:

On July 8 a "let's pretend" day is planned. At this party children will come dressed as grownups, play old-fashioned games, and culminate it with a costume contest.

The story hour is scheduled from 10-12 on July 9; the instrumental music program will be held from 1-5; at 7 p.m. there will be a girls' softball game.

On July 10 at 10 a Pee Wee League softball game will be held; "Surprise Day" will follow.

Outdoor picnic lunches are planned for July 11 at 12, from 3-4 there will be square dancing which includes 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th graders; at 6:30 p.m. there will be "Family Night" at which movies will be shown.

Tournaments are the order of the day for July 12; at 1 and 2:30 there will be Junior League softball games. Junior League softball games are also scheduled for 6:30 and 8 p.m.

The playgrounds will be open from 1 to 5 p.m. through August 2. From August 5 to 30, they will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Tournaments, contests, and special events will continue to be featured at every local playground area. Many other activities will be available that will appeal to children of all ages.
