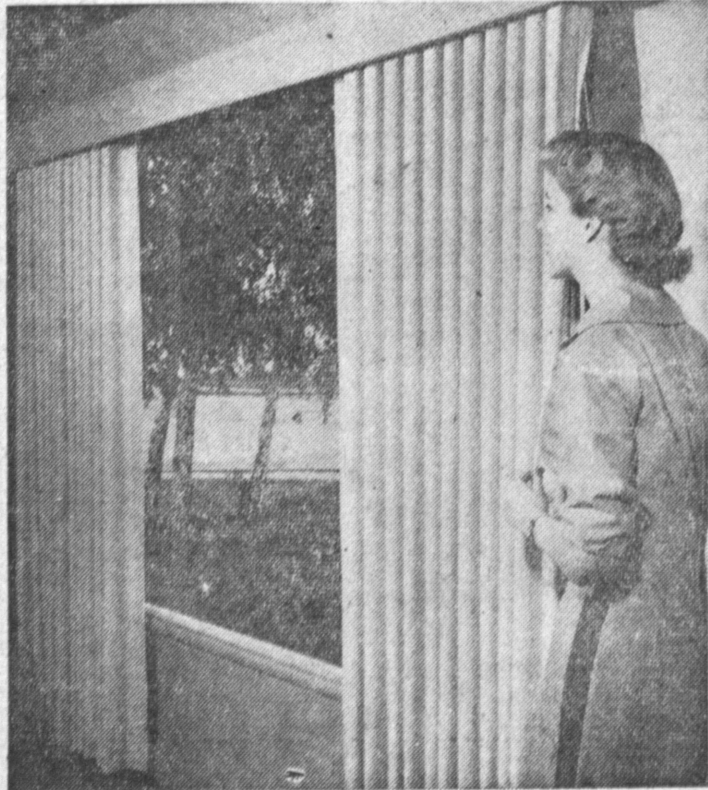

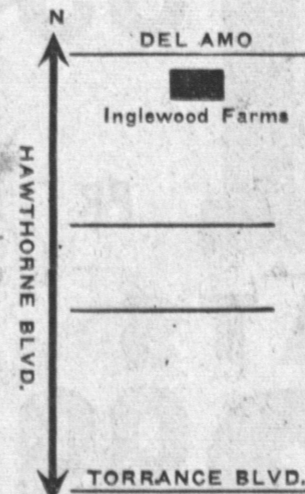
Mrs. Wm. Deuel, recording secretary for the course, took charge of writing answers to questions asked.
