Crafts Program Thrives On Strange Odds and Ends

Take a pipe cleaner, add a sock toe, and maybe a potato and what do you have? It all adds up to the Torrance Recreation department's summer crafts program which teaches youngsters to transform these odds and ends into enjoyable and useful products.

The crafts program, held at all parks and playgrounds, is varied and unique. Just to list a few of the items that are being made would include: paper jewelry made out of pipe cleaners and magazine strips; ash trays made from wire, sock toes and sand; wax paper lamination which is creating floral patterns through the use of wax paper, glue, leaves and string; and paper sculpture derived from corrugated and construction paper. Other items that will be worked on include string painting, potato and block painting stencil work, lanyards and many others.

Don Wright, the instructor, was an art major at the university of Southern California and currently possesses a special secondary credential in art. Wright has participated in local art shows sponsored by the Torrance Art Group and has won honors in prints and sculpture. He is a member of the professional art fraternity, Kappa Pi.

Wright stated that there are several good reasons for developing this recreational facility: to encourage interest and participation in the summer recreation program; to encourage creative expression; to broaden the child's interest and to develop an appreciation of art and crafts; to help the child gain confidence in problem-solving situations; to give the child an opportunity to participate in meaningful learning situations; and to help the child to develop and understand the concept of freedom with responsibility.

This, practically applied, means freedom of choice within the limits of the arts and crafts program that is offered to him, the instructor stated.
