New Principal Installed at Immanuel Lutheran School

Installation of Myron E. Sternberg as the first principal of Immanuel Lutheran school of Redondo Beach will occur at the 11 a.m. service of the Lutheran church at 706 Knob Hill Sunday morning.

Inducting the teacher-principal into his office will be the Rev. Alfred L. T. Schuetz, pastor of Immanuel.

At 5:30 p.m. Sunday a potluck dinner and program will be held in the parish hall to honor the couple; featured on the program will be vocal numbers by Mrs. Barbara Klein Clary, novelty numbers by the church's youth group, the Walter League, and the Junior choir.

Several spontaneous presentations are also slated for the evening program, W. A. Kamrath, chairman of the school board and master of ceremonies indicated.

Sternberg, who comes to Redondo Beach from Canton, Kans., was the principal of an eighth grade school of Immanuel Lutheran church in that rural community for three years before accepting the local call. The 26-year-old principal has also taught elementary school classes in Chicago and in Cecil and Shawano, Wis.

The Wisconsin native is a graduate of Concordia Teachers college at River Forest, Ill., Concordia High school in Milwaukee, and of Zion Lutheran school of Wausau, where he was born. His practice teaching was completed in Melrose Park, Ill.

Immanuel school, opened for the first time last September, under the direction of Mrs. Berlinski, will expand to two classrooms this fall, a spacious new classroom being erected to the east of the present school and Sunday school sector of the church property.

Classes one through seven will be offered this year. Miss Joanne Wasser, formerly of West Covina, will instruct primary grades, while Mr. Sternberg will teach the upper grades.

Enrollment information may be secured from either the new principal or the Rev. Schuetz by calling FRontier 5-8535. Several openings are still available for fall enrollment. While children of church members receive registration priority, other children interested in religious instruction as well as basic elementary school instruction will be accepted for enrollment.

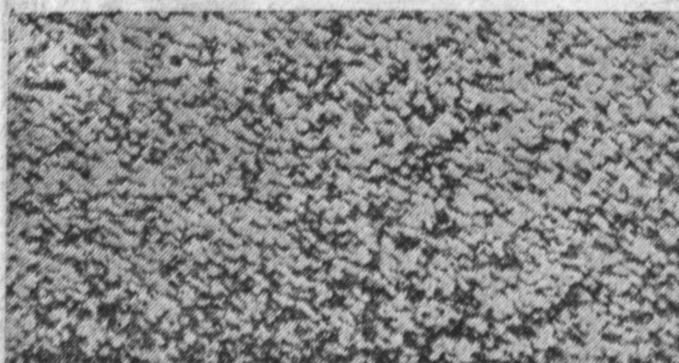

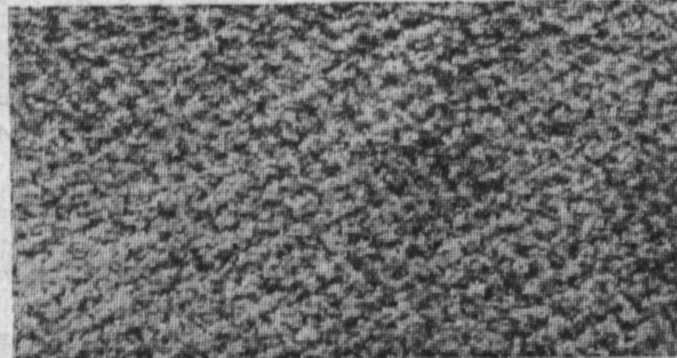
