

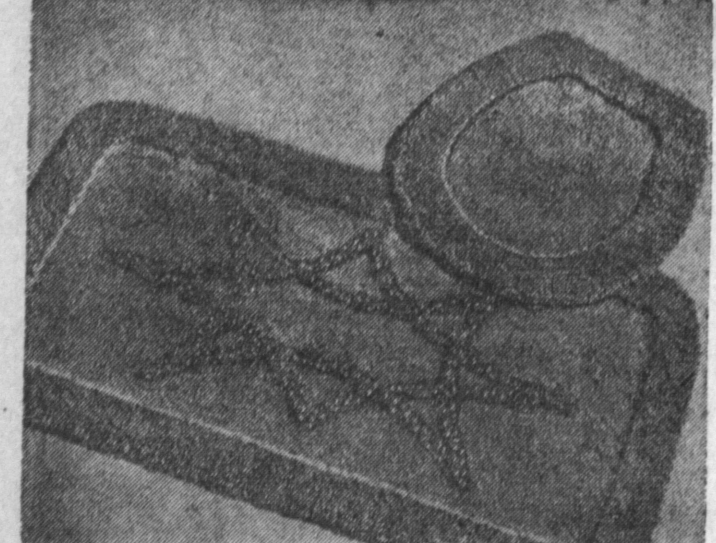

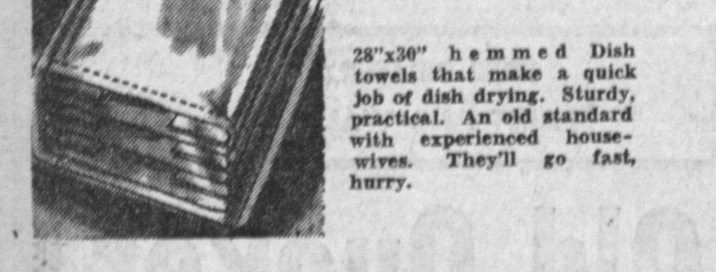

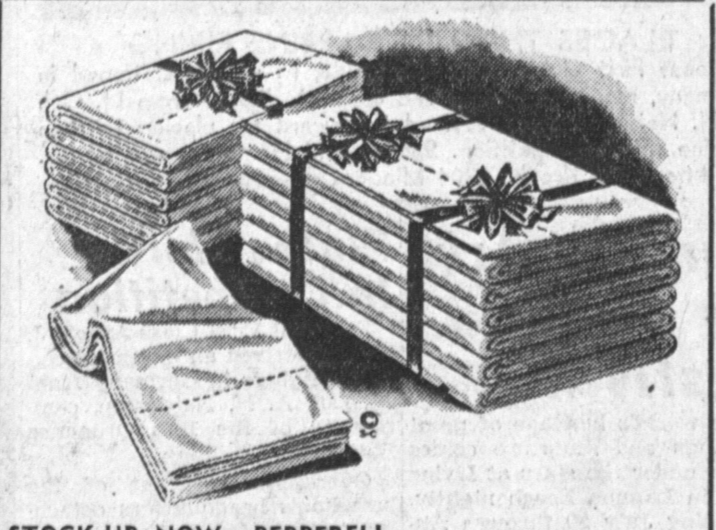

The story begins with John's dramatic rescue during a fire in the rectory and recounts the events that led up to his missionary journey to Georgia, and his seeking for an experience

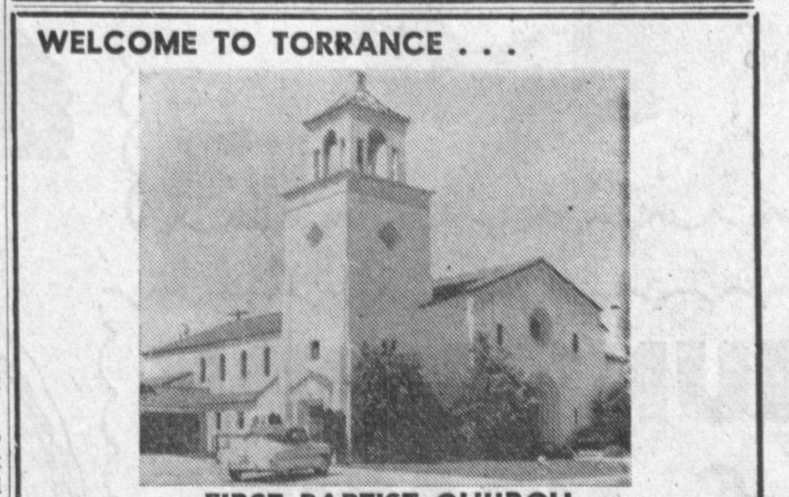
that would satisfy his searching soul.
