Four Torrance high school athletes have returned as coaches to the scene of their former triumphs.

They are Don Garrison, Irwin Edward Kasten, Dick Turner, and Gerald (Jerry) McIvaine. McIvaine, who will receive his coaching qualifications in the fall, will join the others here in September.

Both Kasten, 23, and Turner, 25, were student body presidents in their senior year.

Turner was All-League full-back in 1949 and captain of the Tartar football team the same year.

He received a bachelor of arts degree from the College of Idaho following previous study at El Camino College and UCLA. He began his teaching career at Torrance High this past semester and will be head coach at the school in September.

Kasten, who was All-League end during his Torrance High

days, went to UCLA where he belonged to Sigma Pi and was Hi-Y president.

He was graduated from there last January and joined the Torrance staff.

In September he will be assistant varsity football coach and assistant track coach at the high school.

Garrison, a Tartar graduate of '49, was graduated from Idaho State college where he belonged to Tau Kappa Epsilon and won honors in boxing competitions.

He joined the district staff last September and has been appointed junior varsity coach and assistant track coach at North High school next semester.

**How to Stop Killing Police Officers**

I often read with interest the various suggestions for traffic improvements in your paper and I see that many of these suggestions have been realized in this area.

Many street lights have been installed on dangerous corners, many stop signs replaced with red blinking lights and traffic hazards on streets eliminated.

But some very important suggestions have been ignored despite the fact that they have been mentioned in your paper at several occasions.

We can now see that again the lives of two valuable young policemen have been sacrificed, because those suggestions have been ignored so far. I say "again" because almost every day we can hear that in one or the other part of California, as well as in all other states, fatal or other serious traffic accidents occur because traffic policemen must "chase" traffic violators.

Had your suggestions been fulfilled we could have spared the lives of hundreds of persons. The authorities often invite suggestions regarding this problem. However, if the suggestions are not practical they say it openly but if they are good they ignore it. How could a layman know better than the traffic specialist? And so the incidents happen again and again because the traffic specialist knows better...

You suggested repeatedly that policemen stop chasing traffic violators. Rather the traffic police should have cameras to snap the license number which should be posted above the windshield together with the speedometer. This is a simple thing and I have never read that this is NOT practicable. So what are we waiting for? Hundreds more victims?

As to the fact that the traffic violators mostly use stolen cars you also have suggested very clearly that leaving the keys in a parked car should be considered a serious traffic violation, severely punishable.

It is more important to check left keys in parked cars than to check overparking. Is this also a suggestion which the traffic authorities cannot accept? I don't think so. So why don't they do it? Thousands of cars are being stolen only because the drivers are too lazy to put the keys in the pocket when parking the car. And how much trouble in the light of the consequences...

I only hope that the traffic police will now wake up out of its lethargy and do something about this sad state of affairs. Sincerely yours,

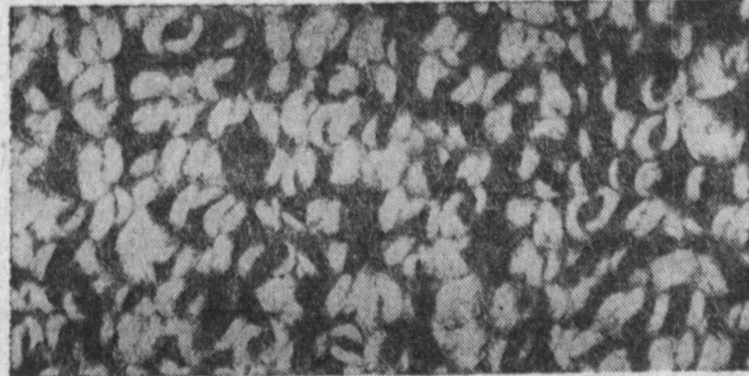

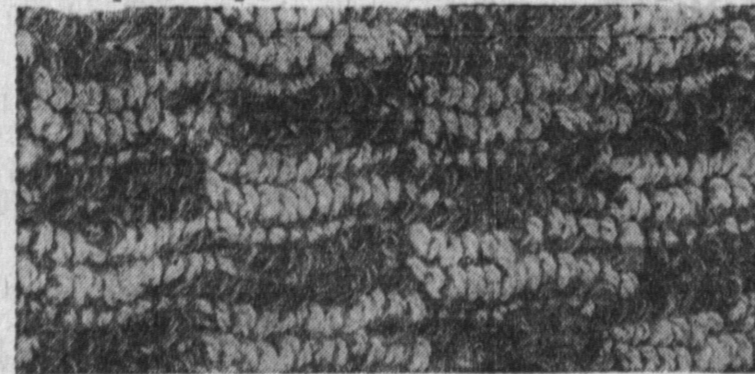

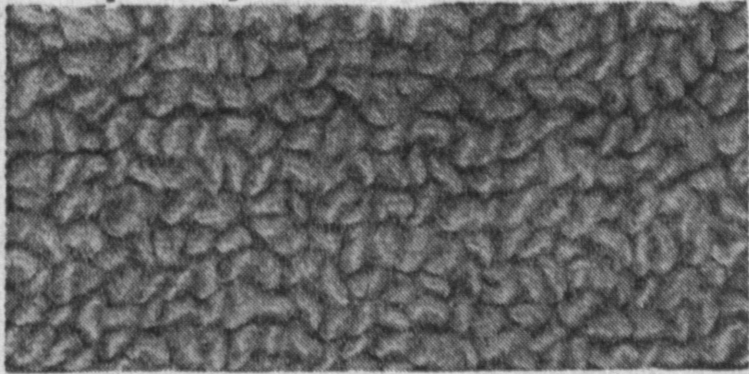
