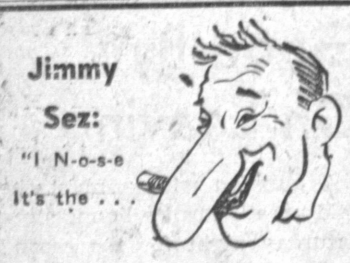


With MP's

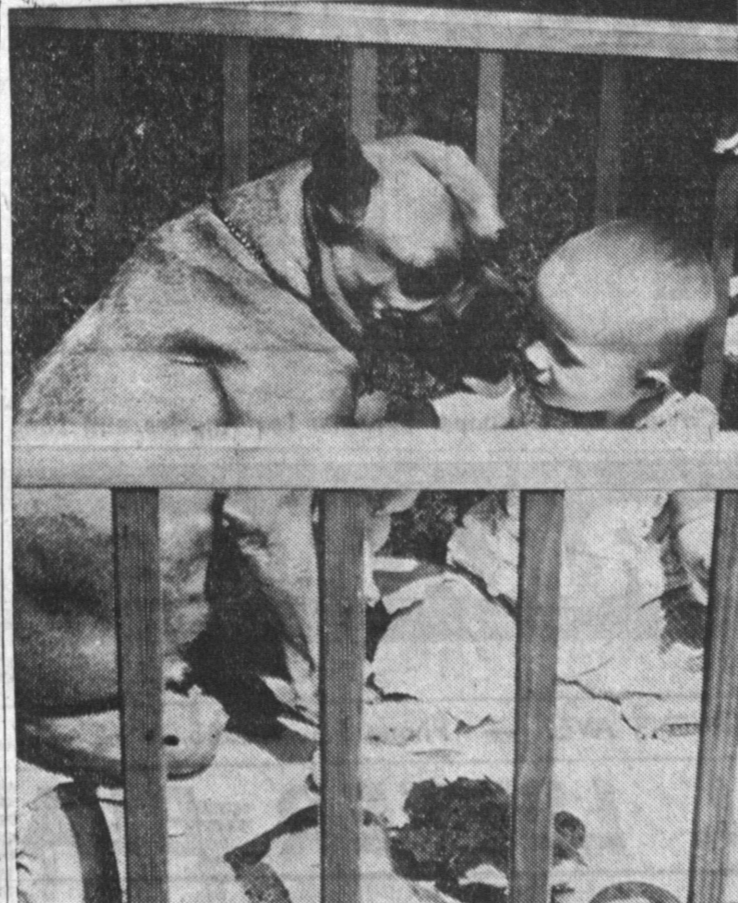
'Moose Night At Wrigley Field' Slated

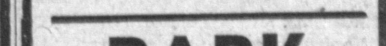

Clark's Sale To Continue

The second week-end of Clark Markets 15th Anniversary Food Sale gets under way today and continues for four days through Sunday, August 11th.

DOMINGUEZ CHANNEL AHEAD OF SCHEDULE

Unusually good progress is being made on the reconstruction of Dominguez channel along a new alignment between Denker and Vermont aves, with the contractor planning to complete the job by next January 1, eight months ahead of the contract time limit. Supervisor Kenneth Hahn reported this week.

To illustrate the progress, he pointed out that although work on the project was started only two months ago, half of the excavation has been already completed. At the present time the contractor has removed more than 160,000 square yards of earth which has been used to fill in slough areas along the right of way.

"This is one of the most important improvements ever made to Dominguez channel and it should assist greatly in providing flood control and protection to people of Gardena, Torrance and adjacent areas," Supervisor Hahn stated.

He pointed out that the project is the first in a program which will ultimately improve the entire length of the channel from the harbor at San Pedro to 120th st. and Crenshaw blvd. at a total cost of \$19,000,000.

The new channel alignment is south and parallel to Artesia blvd., and eliminates two crossings of Artesia, one at Halldale

ave. and the other at Vermont. Construction on the new alignment requires the building of two new bridges across the channel at Normandie and Vermont.

The project also includes the extension of Normandie ave. bond issue storm drain from its present outlet north of Artesia to the new channel.

The new channel will have concrete sides and bottom and will be 18 feet deep and 75 feet wide on a right-of-way of 125 feet.

The contractor, Guy F. Atkinson Co., has crews engaged busily building forms for the concrete work, which will be put in place as soon as the excavation work has been completed, so that the job will be expedited to the most possible degree.

Supervisor Hahn pointed out that if the present rate of progress is maintained, this section of this new improved channel reach will be in operation in time to provide full protection during the coming winter.
