

Fund Raising Breakfast

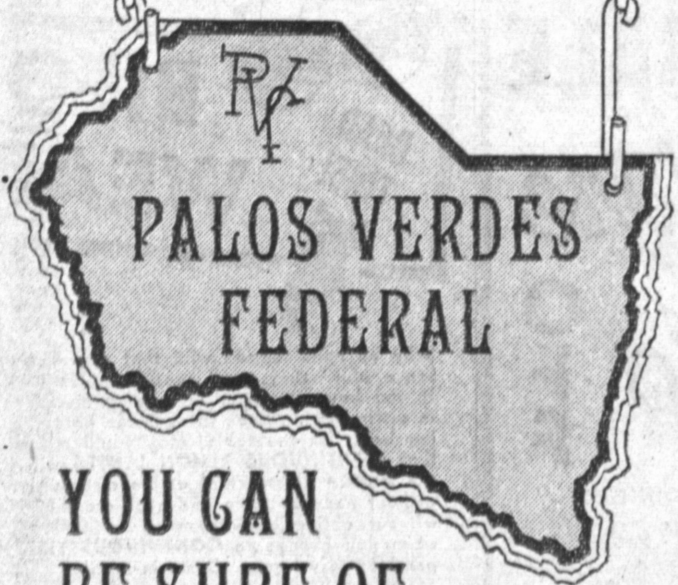

County Health Officers Issues Rabies Warning

Dr. Roy O. Gilbert, Los Angeles County Health Officer, this week issued a warning that rabies is still endemic in Los Angeles County. So far this year there have been reported 21 cases of animal rabies—19 dogs, one cat and one skunk. Because of contacts

with these and other suspected rabid animals 185 persons have had to undergo the painful Pasteur treatment.

Dr. Gilbert issued a special plea that all animal bites be reported immediately to the nearest County Health Center. Compliance with the rabies vaccination programs will not necessarily stop rabies immediately, as the vaccination program is a long-range one, whereas the rabies problem and danger of human infection is one with us now. Failure to immediately report an animal bite could result in additional bites or infection

by the offending animal, or even in the loss of human life. It is well for everyone to realize that it is also a California State law that anyone knowing of an animal bite is responsible for its being reported.

The full cooperation of all residents is requested in that all animal bites be reported to the Torrance Health Center, 2300 W. Carson, or to Dr. Ben Kogan, M.D., District Health Officer, and complete information be given as to the patient and the animal concerned. The animal will then be closely observed during the critical 15 days as a protection to the person bitten. It is also requested that pets be kept on leashes or inside a fenced yard at all times. 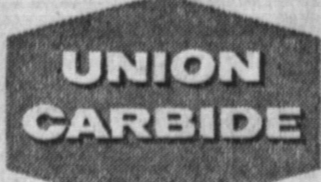
