Mrs. Greene begins her third year with the school this fall. Member mothers participate regularly, which allows for a lower tuition. The Gardena Coop is a member of the Los Angeles Council of Coops and has representation in that group.

As a result, latest methods and techniques in the training of the pre-schooler are readily available. Regular discussions of individual and group problems are led by the professional staff in an effort to help the parents toward a better understanding of their own children.

The school is non-sectarian and inter-racial and welcomes any and all applicants who wish to enroll.
