

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Have fun in the sun...SAFELY!

Those long stretches of sand along our coast are wonderful summer playgrounds. They provide the whole family with a grand place for healthful exercise and recreation in the sun. But carelessness on the beach, or in the water, can spoil a whole summer-perhaps an entire lifetime. By observing a few simple rules, you can prevent possible tragedy.

1. If you can't swim, never go out beyond your own depth. If you can swim, never overestimate your ability.

2. Diving in shallow or tidal waters is always risky; don't do it.

3. Undertows are treacherous; when a strong eurrent is running, stay out of the water.

4. Keep a close watch on your small children at all times, on the beach or in the water.

5. Never tease or force another person, particularly a child, to attempt a feat beyond his capabilities.

6. Avoid roughhousing, and games that might annoy or injure others.

7. Remember that the sun can cause serious burns. Don't overexpose yourself, or allow your children to do so.

8. Get prompt attention for cuts caused by broken glass or shells, to prevent infection.

9. Obey posted beach regulations and guards' warnings

10. Don't be a show-off - it may be your last performance.


