9115 W. 'G' St., made the statement after he was picked up with three juveniles in an intoxicated condition on 238th St. in Wilmington.

Konkier, who also claimed he was an escapee from the Walla Walla State prison, was apprehended when police answered a complaint from a resident of the neighborhood, who said the suspect was tearing up small trees in the area.

Police said when they arrived they saw Konkier knock one of his female juvenile companions to the ground, tear up a small tree from its roots and defy arresting officers. When they tried to apprehend him, he fought with them and continually attempted to escape before he was finally subdued and placed in jail.

**Drunken Spree**  
He admitted while on the drinking spree he struck a parked auto on Calle Andalucia and continued on without stopping. He was being held on charges of disturbing the peace, hit run, contributing to the delinquency of a minor, resisting arrest, and attempted escape.

Police officers were checking out Konkier's story before they would comment on a possible link to the El Segundo Murders.

**Highland Park Suspect**  
On Tuesday police in Highland Park booked a 21-year-old suspect on suspicion of assault with intent to commit murder when he threatened to kill police sent to quell a domestic argument.

Eugene Newby, it was thought, resembled the description of the El Segundo murderer also but no link between the two has been found.

Newby's estranged wife had reported to the police that he had taken their 18-month-old son.

Officers Gilliam and R. L. Raymond had gone to Newby's house after Mrs. Theresa Newby, 20, of 4305 Guardia Drive, proved legal guardianship of the child.

**Pulls Gun**  
Gilliam walked into the bedroom while Newby dressed the baby whereupon the latter suddenly whipped out the gun, threatening to kill the officer.

Gilliam grappled with Newby and disarmed him when Officer Raymond rushed into the room.

Newby was booked at Highland Park Station on suspicion of assault with intent to commit murder.
