Long-play albums for the fall season are now hitting the market and Decca has some of the best heard in a long time. There are so many, it's hard to test-listen to them all but here are some of Decca's best and latest:

Al Jolson's 12 selections, originally recorded for Kraft Music Hall broadcasts, are on a new Decca album entitled **Among My Souvenirs**. It's quite naturally great—the writer's pick of many fine new Decca lp albums. Some include the title, **Roses of Picardy, Say It Isn't So, Little Pal, Memories, Always, That Old Gang of Mine**, etc.

Right behind the Jolson album actually on a par with it—is Decca's **Club Durante**. This one features the one and only Jimmy Durante and many guest stars, all doing their best in Jimmy's musical skits.

Guest stars include Ethel Barrymore, Bing Crosby, Peter Lawford, Sophie Tucker, Eddie Cantor, Al Jolson, Bob Hope, etc. One of Decca's great popular music, good fun albums. Good listening, too; Durante has rhythm, in spite of his clowning.
