**Factory Employment Increases**

Factory employment in the Los Angeles-Long Beach Metropolitan Area increased last month to 765,000 wage and salary workers, the highest August on record, Ernest B. Webb, California Director of Industrial Relations, announced today.

Manufacturing employment rose by 1200, between July and August, contrasted with a gain of 15,800 for the same period last year and 9300 in 1955. This year's rise reflected seasonal additions in food processing, hiring for new model production in automobiles, and continued expansion in electronics. These increases were tempered by cutbacks at aircraft plants.

From August 1956, employment was up by 15,900, or 2 percent. This was the smallest year-to-year margin for any month since October 1954. Most of the total gain over the year resulted from increases in industries manufacturing durable manufacturers alone accounted for more than three-fourths of the gain in the past 12 months. Employment in aircraft was under last year.

New all-time highs were established in the chemicals and electrical equipment industries.
