### Recreation Congress Will Be Held In Long Beach

Staff members of the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation will appear as speakers and panel members at the 39th National Recreation Congress which will convene at Long Beach from Monday, September 30 through Friday, October 4.

The convention, which will attract recreation personnel and executives from throughout the United States, will devote its sessions to a wide field of current recreation subjects, including underwater recreation, also known as skin diving.

Chairman John Anson Ford of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors will preside at the closing Recreation Congress session on Friday morning at 11 a.m. in the Lafayette hotel ballroom.

Supervisor Ford will introduce the speaker, Los Angeles County Counsel Harold W. Kennedy, whose subject will be "The Philosophy of Recreation and its Legal Aspects."

A novel feature of the convention will occur Tuesday, October 1, at 4:15 p.m. when Don St. Hill, Los Angeles County Diving instructor, will conduct a demonstration of underwater safety (skin diving) at the Long Beach Polytechnic High School pool.

St. Hill will reveal how the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation has pioneered in this fast-growing recreation activity by training several thousand divers since 1954.

County Parks and Recreation Director Norman S. Johnson will appear Wednesday morning at 11 a.m. in a session on "A Formula for Recreation in the Fringe Areas." Johnson also will participate in the Institute in Recreation Administration during the conclave.

### Will Retain Development

Geo. A. Beavers, Jr., Chairman of the Housing Authority of the City of Los Angeles, announced today that at the Regular Commission meeting held today, it was unanimously decided to continue the Authority's efforts to retain the 400 unit Normont Terrace Housing Development, No. Cal 4-23, located at 253 st. and Vermont ave. in Los Angeles, as a home for senior citizens.

The Executive Director of the Authority, Howard L. Holtzendorf, was authorized to negotiate with the Public Housing Administration in an effort to purchase the Federal Government's interest in the Project and to continue the negotiations with the City of Los Angeles for the City's financial assistance.

Beavers stated, "In view of the tremendous interest evidenced by many civic and private organizations, as well as many individuals, it was the view of all the commissioners that the housing problems of our senior citizens are so acute that every effort should be made to retain and develop this project for their use."

### TRAINING CENTER FOR PARENTS

The Parents' Training center, 11345 Virginia ave., Compton, a non-profit day school for brain injured and emotionally disturbed children, has started their fall program of training and therapy. The objective of this organization is to give emotional release and guidance in social and academic education for these children. In addition, parents are given the opportunity to explore their feelings about their children and learn how to guide and live with them.

The school is under the guidance of Edward Ohanian, Ph.D., co-director of the Psychology-Speech clinic of Pepperdine college.

The program now in operation includes a trained therapist daily from Pepperdine college to help the child in his educational and social adjustment.

The center is open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday the year around. Interviews may be arranged for interested parents or professional groups by calling NE. 5-9060 during school hours or LO. 7-5050 at other times.

At present the center is maintained solely by the parents of the children enrolled. Your friendship and understanding is welcomed. Financial, physical, or material assistance from interested persons or organizations would be very greatly appreciated.
