

Harbor Area Chairman Discusses Campaign

In speaking of the Community Chest campaign goal of \$10,300,000, Jay A. Robinson, Harbor Area chairman for the 1957-'58 campaign, asked the question, "How high is up?" referring to the amount of money the Chest needs and will need to meet the requirements of the 167 services which the Chest supports.

He spoke at an Agency Participation meeting held today at the Homer Toberman Settlement house, San Pedro, a Chest supported agency. All directors of agencies in the Harbor Area were asked to come and bring a member from their boards of directors.

He said that the fund raising goal is nine per cent higher this year than last year and that Los Angeles is expected to grow to be the largest city in the United States and therefore to become the one with the most problems. According to Robinson, the services supported by the Chest don't have and never have had enough money to fill the needs of the area which they serve. For example, the money available for solving the serious problem of mental health is only ten per cent of what it should be.

Speaking directly to people from the agencies, he said, "The life of your agency depends on the success of the Community Chest campaign. The agencies must do the most they can to help with the campaign. They must go out for the maximum dollar."

He reminded them, "There could be a person soliciting at a citizen's door every day of the year if every fund raising organization in the United States conducted a separate campaign. People should be thankful that the Community Chest comes only once a year to ask for a contribution to support 167 services. By contributing to the Chest, a person does get the most out of giving."

HAHN GETS SUPPORT ON FREEWAY EXTENSION

Strong support for Supervisor Kenneth Hahn's campaign to secure funds for extension of the Harbor freeway from 124th to 190th street came this week as the City Council of Compton adopted a resolution urging that the necessary funds be budgeted and that the project be given priority.

Supervisor Hahn recently led a large delegation of public officials and civic leaders of the southwest and Bay cities to Sacramento to attend the budget hearing of the State Highway Commission and urge inclusion of funds to continue the freeway construction to 190th street.

Plans Completed
 It was pointed out that the plans for the next segment of the Harbor freeway are completed, the right of way secured,

and that the project can go to contract as soon as funds are provided by the State Highway Commission.

Major Route

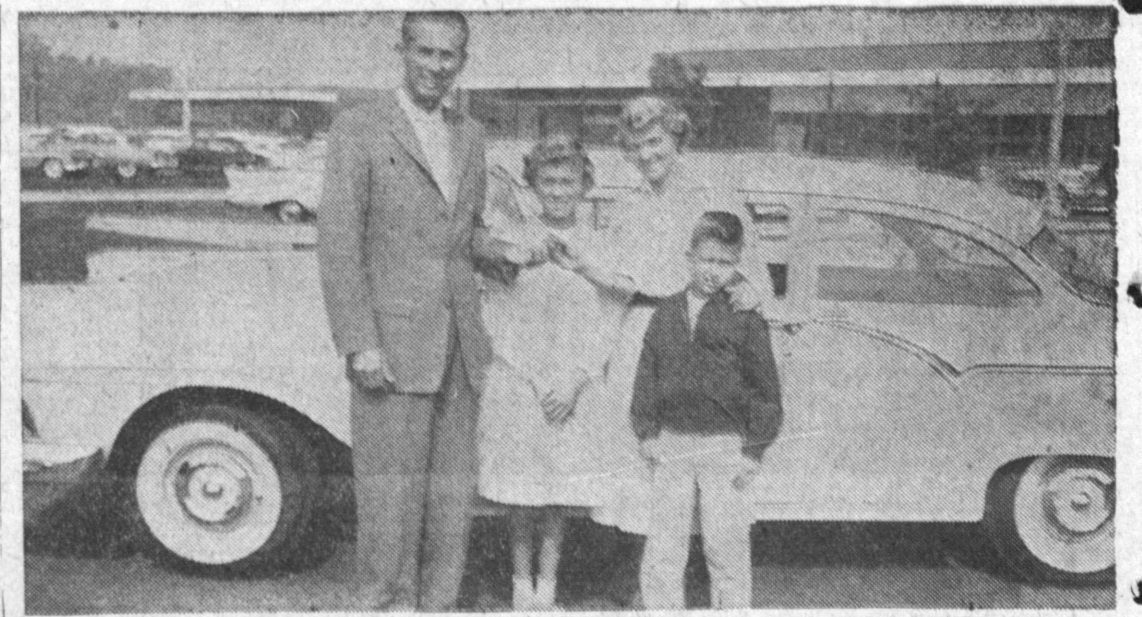
In adopting its resolution, the City Council of Compton pointed out that the Harbor freeway serves as a major north-south route serving the Compton area but that "the section now under construction terminates at 124th street making it necessary for people in the Compton area to travel a considerable distance over narrow and inadequate surface roads before reaching the beginning of the freeway."
