Gil Wells Are Attractive Hazard to Children

Some while back an ordinance of the City Council of Torrance providing for the regulation of oil wells was enacted to circumvent what many city officials felt was inadequate and outmoded state statutes governing oil wells.

The state statutes were enacted in a day when many oil wells were nowhere near large cities or communities, where they might ecome a safety hazard. As a matter fact, some of the wells were applicant. in regions so remote, it was almost impossible to maintain them.

And such was the case right here in Torrance. For in 1922, when the oil development first began, no special regulatory measures were needed to guard against dangerous conditions-simply dress. because no one but qualified workmen ever went into the inaccessable areas of the Torrance of yesteryear.

Today, the picture has changed considerably. There are no inaccessable areas too remote to be traversed here in Torrance. As a matter of fact, areas of danger to children are so accessable that a great deal of concern has arisen among citizens.
