However, investigators say many times, it is impossible to determine who is legally responsible for the well, and this may take months. Powell's authority however, is such, that a real dire menace may be acted upon by virtue of the police powers vested

"When a violation is noted," Powell said, "the important hing is that a citizen call or write us immediately. We have a pattern mapped out by which we are attacking the problem. But, we'll deviate from this pattern to handle any complaint where the violation is so flagrant that injury or death may result."

This citizen is the parent of 4 small children who lives in the region in question. Her concern was for the safety of her children and the children of others.

Upon approaching the area, we were immediately accosted by an irate well owner charging that we had no right to be present on the open area in question. He vehemently charged that we (the Torrance Press) were guilty of sensationalism, that we really didn't have a gripe, that we were only out to sell newspapers. He angrily denied us permission to take pictures. However, we already had enough to prove our point.

It is incumbent upon us as citizens to take a few lessons from the past where serious injuries have occurred to children. With a little foresight, we can prevent future injuries and yes, even death of innocent children, most of whom, too mmature to recognize moving death traps.


