These new family members should add to the merriment on the Danny Thomas show which premieres next Monday, 8 p.m., Channel 2.

Marjorie Lord who made four previous appearances on the show as nursemaid to the Williams children, Rusty and Terry, takes over as the new mother. Her daughter is played by 4½-year-old Angela Cartwright. William Demarest will appear as her father and Danny Williams' new in-law.

Commentator Drew Pearson To Speak November 3

Commentator Drew Pearson, scheduled to be the principal guest at the Jewish National Fund's "Kiryat Malachim" Annual Conference on November 3, yesterday sent messages from Tel Aviv to the Jewish National Fund.

The distinguished journalist, now touring the Middle East, America, and Theodore Strim-Informed Mendel N. Fisher, ex-ling, president of the JNF Executive director of the JNF in all of Los Angeles, that "I have

seen JNF projects in Israel and have interviewed Prime Minister Ben Gurion. I am very impressed with your work here and will have a special report on this for the Kiryat Malachim Conference when I arrive in Los Angeles.

In addition to the important role to be played by Pearson in the conference, Executive Director Mendel Fisher will fly to Los Angeles to participate.

Fisher, who has been executive director of America's JNF for 23 years, has been active in Zionist causes for over three decades. Like Pearson, he is basically a journalist by profession, working on the staff of the top Boston newspapers for many years and contributing widely to the Anglo-Jewish press.

"Our November 3 conference at the Ambassador hotel will also be well attended because civic leaders and Zionists in this area want very much to hear the first-hand reports of Drew Pearson and Mendel Fisher."

In addition to the program of up-to-the-minute information on "Los Angeles in Israel" and the current political situation, the conference program will include vocal renditions by the eminent soprano, Emma Schaver. Mrs. Schaver's repertoire includes traditional Hebrew and Yiddish melodies and modern Israeli songs. She has been widely acclaimed by enthusiastic audiences throughout America for her delightful voice and wonderful feeling for Yiddish and Hebrew music.

The conference period celebrating the beginning of the \$500,000 Kiryat Malachim-Los Angeles in Israel Project will include a "Conference and Concert" for the JNF Folk Organizations at the Park Manor on Saturday, November 2.
