## DEFEATING POLIO

Figures released recently by the U. S. Public Health Service In Recruiting show that the fight against polio is being steadily won. Although show that the fight against polio is being steadily won. Although there has been doubt as to the progress of the battle from time Volunteers to time in recent years, the latest figures show conclusively that the polio vaccine has accomplished miracles in this respect.

Only 3217 cases of polio have been reported this year as Harbor Area communities in reagainst 7073 reported last year. Moreover, the paralytic type cruitment of volunteer workers of polio, which is the worst, has been reduced by an even greater for the 1957.'58 Community margin.
