TEMPLE OFFERS BIBLE, HEBREW INSTRUCTION

Two courses will be offered at Temple Menorah, 112 N. Catalina, Redondo Beach, beginning on Tuesday nights in October, the first of which was held on October 15, 8:15 p.m. The courses will be conducted by Rabbi Henri E. Front and the public is invited.

One of the courses will be on the Bible: Also taken up in this course will be why some books were inserted into the canon of the Bible, and why some books were left out and put into other texts.

The course will also discuss the contents of the Five Books of Moses (the first five books of the Holy Scripture). The fall semester of this course will be offered on these dates: October 22, November 5 and 19, December 3 and 17.

The second course offered, instruction in the Hebrew language, will meet on alternate Tuesday nights at 8:15 at the Temple, as follows: October 15 and 29, November 12 and 26, and December 10 and 24.

Those attending will learn to read and write Hebrew and be able to read from the prayer book. The fundamentals of grammar will be taken up at the same time.

Rabbi announces that if the demand is great enough the temple will have a double session on class nights so that those attending can complete the course more rapidly.

It is expected that by the second session students will be speaking Hebrew.

Church Sets Celebration

On Friday night, October 18, 8:30 p.m., Temple Menorah of Redondo Beach, 112 N. Catalina, will have their celebration of the holiday, Simchas Torah—the rejoicing of the law.
