Chest House-to-House Drive Opens Nov. 4

"For children, the Chest offers help for a crippled body, a crippled mind, or a crippled family." Mrs. Arthur C. Ackerson, Harbor Area Residential Chairman for the 1957-'58 Community Chest campaign, told residential division chairman and section chairmen from all the cities of the Harbor Area, last week.

The residential volunteer workers who met at the Plush Horse restaurant heard Mrs. Ackerson explain a "simple problem in grade school arithmetic."

Holding aloft a small blackboard on which she figured the problem with chalk, Mrs. Ackerson told her scholars to "take 167, the number of agencies which the Chest supports, and divide by 52, the number of weeks in a year."

The answer, checked by Mrs. Ackerson, was three with 11 left over. "That means," she told them, "three campaigns conducted every week of the year with 11 more to be worked in somehow. The Chest reduces these to one campaign which provides funds to support all 167 services."

AID TO CHILDREN
She pointed out that the Chest appeal is really for children. For example, 80 cents out of every dollar goes to help children. Supported by the Chest, there is the Children's Hospital and the Orthopaedic Hospital and Clinic for the children who are physically crippled. For the emotionally crippled, there are forty-five youth serving agencies, including Scouts, clubs, and settlements. And for the crippled family, there are 50 services besides 34 child care services for the children of these families.

She finished with, "Perhaps your passport to heaven will be giving and working for the Community Chest."

Also on hand with some words of inspiration were Denver Bullock, San Pedro City Chairman; Glenn Koger, Torrance City Chairman; Ernest Brower, Wilmington City Chairman; and Paul Mandel, Torrance Residential Chairman.

Said Bullock, "Be proud when you knock on that door that you are representing the Community Chest."

WAY OF LIFE
Koger added, "We have a way of life that needs to be protected. We feel that because the man in the plant is giving, it is not necessary to give at home. Therefore, children are growing up without learning the need of giving."

"I hope we can appeal to people at home to give, not much maybe only a nickel or a dime from a child, fifty cents or a dollar from a housewife, so that the feeling of giving will be individual."

Referring to the campaign slogan, "Give the most where you get the most out of giving," Brower said that it was "one of the best I have ever seen. It has a great story to tell."

Lastly, Paul Mandel urged the residential solicitors to get their job done as quickly as possible. The residential kick-off is November 4. "Knock on every door," he told them. "Only with complete coverage may we hope to meet our goal of \$10,300.00."
