Since the day also has been designated as National Catholic Youth Community Sunday, all Catholic Youth Organization members will be encouraged to receive Holy Communion in club groups in their local parishes.

The CYO Federation of Single Adult Clubs will sponsor a commemorative Silver Jubilee Mass at St. Vibia Cathedral in Los Angeles, marking its 25th anniversary.

The Most Rev. Alden J. Bell, auxiliary-bishop, will be the celebrant, Rev. John P. Langgulle, assistant CYO director and federation moderator, will preach the sermon. A breakfast will follow at the Biltmore Hotel, with Jack Haley as emcee.

All CYO groups will participate in week-long activities. Neighborhood centers will feature an open house for all members of the community, a sport night, teen night, board appreciation night and other events.

On an international basis the week has been proclaimed by His Holiness Pope Plus XII and on a national basis by President Eisenhower and the governors of all states. The theme will be "Healthier, Holier, Happier . . ." a goal

for all youth in the attainment of physical and spiritual balance for greater fulfillment of life.

Classes are for six weeks (consecutive Saturdays or Sundays) duration and include all phases of smallbore rifle training.


Interested students must come to the range with a parent or legal guardian to enroll. 22 caliber bolt action rifles must be furnished by the student. Official targets are issued by the instructor.
