El Camino Primed for East LA Game Saturday

Action in the Metropolitan Conference highlights the Southland junior college grid scene this week-end, with unbeaten El Camino swinging back into action Saturday.

The Warriors journey to East Los Angeles to meet Coach Clyde Johnson's Huskies in a Metro loop tilt which will feature two of the smallest quarterbacks in the nation. El Camino will be led by durable Larry Manly (5-9, 165) while East LA will be guided by slippery Seitaro Miyano (5-6, 154).

Manly's two last-half touchdown passes gave El Camino a 24-19 win over Santa Monica two weeks ago. Miyano was instrumental in the Huskies' 17-7 win over Taft and 12-7 whipping of Pasadena.

El Camino's eleven took advantage of a one-week lay-off afforded by a scheduled bye last week while preparing to meet the East Los Angeles at ELA stadium Saturday.

The rest gave some of the boys who are out with injuries and the wide spread flu a two-week rest before having to meet the once-defeated Huskies.

El Camino so far this season is riding atop a 3-0 record with victories over Phoenix, Modesto, and Santa Monica. In each of these games the Camino eleven has shown constant improvement in offensive power, with the passing and play calling of Larry Manly and the bulldozing power of Bruce Seifert. The latter leads the Metropolitan Conference in scoring with a total of 30 points in the 3 games played.

Gadgets in Car Windows Must Go, CHP Says

Drivers who have novelties and other gadgets hanging between them and the car windshields are in violation of the law, says the California highway patrol.

"A new law passed by the 1957 legislature prohibits any person from driving a motor vehicle upon a highway with any object so placed in or upon the vehicle as to obstruct the driver's clear view through the windshield," declared Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell. "This includes novelties such as dice, baby shoe, gadgets on strings or springs, and all such items."

"The patrol is charged with enforcement of all the vehicle laws and proper enforcement action will be taken against drivers who continue to drive with these items hanging in the car so as to obstruct the driver's clear view," Caldwell stated. "Obstruction of the driver's view is a recorded contributing factor in many traffic accidents each year."

"Motorists are urged to comply with this law and help in the fight against traffic accidents in California."
