Nativity School Begins \$130,000 Addition

Construction of a new addition to Nativity Catholic School at 2371 W. Carson, began last week. The addition will be a two-story building with partial basement which will be used as a library.

The first story will be an assembly room which will also have a movable Altar so that it can also be used for religious services on special occasions. The second story will have four classrooms.

Sealed bids were opened last week and the low bid was submitted by R. G. Webb, Inc., General Contractors, Long Beach. The building, when finished, will cost approximately \$130,000. It is due to be completed on April 15, 1958.

The architectural design, by Anthony J. Kauzer of Los Angeles, is modern contemporary. This addition was necessitated

by the great growth in population in Torrance which required Nativity School for the first time to go on half-day sessions in its lower grades. There are also a large number of children on the waiting list.

A drive for funds for the new building will begin in the near future, it was announced by the Pastor, Reverend Patrick J. McGuinness.
