

Rehabilitation Project Sought At County Jail

Acting on a motion by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, the board of supervisors this week requested the sheriff's department and the chief administrative officer to investigate the possibility of setting up an occupational therapy and rehabilitation program at the new maximum security unit of the county jail soon to be opened at Wayside Honor rancho.

In presenting his motion, Supervisor Hahn suggested that a carpentry and cabinetry shop be provided so that inmates could repair county office furniture, desks, chairs and book-cases. "This would be a good constructive activity for the prisoners and would also enable the county to get the most possible use out of office furniture,"

Supervisor Hahn declared. The shop could also turn out special items of equipment needed by schools for handicapped children, and county institutions such as Rancho Los Amigos and Olive View sanatorium, he said. "Rehabilitation of the prisoners and transforming them into useful, productive citizens is one of the most important goals of the county jail system," Supervisor Hahn stated, "and I believe that these inmates should have constructive work to do."
