Tartars Face Scrappy Leuzinger Saturday

Undeclared in league play in their first three games, the Tartar grid machine will travel to Leuzinger to challenge the Olympians in a Saturday night game. Torrance, now in second spot in the Bay League with two

wins and a tie, have a comparatively easy opponent this week as compared to the power squads they have battled thus far. Leuzinger has lost five out of six games this season.

The Olympians, unspectacular as they have been this season still possess a potential powerhouse, and could give the Tartars a good scrap. They have more returning lettermen than any club in the league, plus some outstanding transfers. But they have been harder hit by the flu epidemic than any of their rivals, and the effects were still evident last week as Redondo ran off devastating gains through their weakened line. They managed to come out of that game with a tie however, which might indicate that they are gaining back pre-season strength.

The Tartar's offense will be hampered by the absence of halfbacks Bob Grajeda and Manfred Mainer, both of whom are suffering from ankle injuries. Torrance's powerful defense should hold Leuzinger to one touchdown or less, so the Tartar ball carriers will have to score at least twice to win.

Other Bay League action this week will pit Inglewood against Santa Monica, while Redondo takes on Mira Costa. After this week there is only one game remaining on the League schedule.

Warriors Duel Bakersfield

The annual feud between the Warriors of El Camino college and the Renegades from Bakersfield will resume with an 8 p.m. kick-off Saturday night in the sparkling new stadium of the northern-most member of the Metropolitan Conference.

Despite their blemished records in conference play this year, both teams will throw their all into this battle. Losing to San Diego, the 'Grads recovered to garner wins in their last two outings.

The Warriors have reversed the procedure. A win over Santa Monica was followed by an overwhelming reverse at the hands of the East LA Huskies and a soaking 18-6 defeat by the San Diego Knights Saturday night.

The Warrior forces are still in the process of reassembling following the loss of Dick Keeler, who is expected to be out for the season, and Tom McDonnell, who will probably not see action against Bakersfield. Kirk King, McDonnell's successor in the line-up, was shaken badly against the Knights.

These injuries weakened a line which failed to hold in the last two encounters.

The Camino backfield appeared to be one-deep in the San Diego game. Larry Manly, Bruce Seifert, and Paul Pedigo did 95 per cent of the ball carrying for the Warriors. Manly played the entire game, with Seifert and Pedigo seeing action keeping close pace with him. Gordon Henderson stepped in for Seifert for one set of downs. San Diego Junior college grabbed a stranglehold on the Meerooyolitan Conference football scramble Saturday night, when the visiting Knights won their fourth straight, with their 18-6 victory over the Warriors.
