After Extraction "What is an Immediate den ture?"-asks Mrs. L. R., of Har-

bor City. An immediate denture is one where the remaining natural teeth are removed and the den-

ture is placed directly in the mouth, so the patient does not have to go without teeth. Usually the front teeth are left. Then when the denture is ready, these are extracted and the den-

ture inserted. As the gums heal, the denture will gradually loosen up and sore spots may develop as the denture ontinues to settle. If the denture becomes too loose, your dentist

may recommend some form of adhesive to help you until the gums are completely healed. The denture can then be re fitted, or in cases where the change is so great that the bite

has changed, the dentures may have to be remade,
