Seek Phones **On Freeways**

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn insisted this week that the State Highway Department should install emergency telephones on freeways in Los Angeles County so that the motoring public can Communicate immediately with the proper authorities when help is needed.

Recently the Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution by Supervisor Hahn urging the State Highway Department to install the emergency 'phones for the safety of the 700,000 motorists who use the freeways in Los Angeles County each day. In an answer this week, State Highway Engineer G. T. McCoy wrote a letter stating that the State Highway Department will not install the emergency telephones.

Instead, McCoy suggested that motorists should look for uni form signs (which are being proposed) on the freeways indicating the location of public telephones off the freeways near the end of off-ramps.

"This is not a practical idea," Supervisor Hahn declared. "When a person has an emergency on the freeway, such as a flat tire, motor trouble, accident, fire or sickness, he can't be expected to go looking for



McCoy also stated that "some progress" is being made toward establishing public telephones as a "convenience" along the freeways at locations where they would not present a hazard to traffic.

This would make it possible for motorists to stop and talk to their relatives, friends and business associates.

What is needed, Supervisor Hahn declared, is a "call box" type of emergency 'phone linked firectly to an emergency communications center. "This would enable the motorist in trouble to just pick up the phone to get help started on the way."


