"I have worn dentures for years. Because of gum shrinkage they don't fit any more. I like the way the teeth look; so can they be used in a new plate?"—asks Mrs. J. K. of Torrance.

Yes, the old teeth from your denture can be used in a new plate and can be used in such a way as to save you one-half the cost of a new plate.

The technique is this: A brand new impression is taken of the mouth and the old teeth are cut off the old plate and re-set exactly as they were onto the new plate. This works out wonderfully well where a new bite is not required. Completely brand new plastic is used throughout and the finished product is a brand new denture except for the fact that the teeth from the former plate are used.


