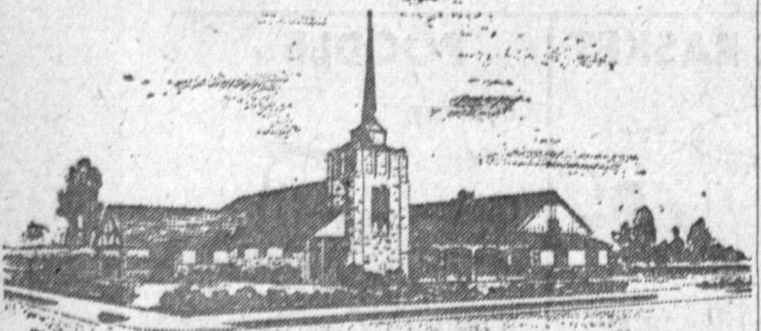
St. Andrews Church to Hold Dedication Sunday
