"Don't spoll your Christ-mas season," Benner added, "if you are using one of these ers, have it checked periodically by the gas company or a reliable service agency . . . or better, have it replaced with a vented heater that carries the products of combustion out of the house through a vent pipe and has the gas burner completely enclosed to eliminate the fire hazard."


