

immediately after receiving your statement. Motor Vehicles Director Paul Mason says the sooner you do it, the better off you will be.

"Toward the end of the renewal period," he added, 'there's invariably a rush, and people find themselves standing in line to beat the deadline." To delay beyond the deadline can be costly. The law requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to collect penalties on any registration renewed after February4. The penalty scale is 100 percent of the registration fee. 50 percent of the vehicle license fee for passengr cars, and 100 percent of the weight fees on commercial vehicles.

The formula for computing fees, as adopted by the State Legislature, is: Annual registration fee, \$8; vehicle license fee, 2 percent of the value of the vehicle, with a minimum of \$1, which means that the minimum for any car is \$9. The vehicle license fee is collected in lieu of city and county personal property taxes, and is returned to the cities and counties in which the vehicle is domiciled.

The 1958 card showing fees due is an improvement over that of previous years, in that both portions contain the name and address of the owner.


