'God Is Life' Sermon Topic

God, as the source and substance of life, is the theme of the Lesson-Sermon on "Life" in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, Sunday. The Golden Text of the sermon is this song of the Psalmist, David (27:1), "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?"

As the sermon progresses, Solomon's inspired words from the fourth chapter of Proverbs further keynote the theme, "The path of the just is as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the perfect day" (4:18).

A correlative passage from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, states, "The way is straight and narrow, which leads to the understanding of God is the only life. It is a warfare with the flesh, in which we must conquer sin, sickness, and death, either here or hereafter—certainly before we can reach the goal of Spirit, or life in God" (p. 324).
